

IYNT 2014 Grading Criteria

The Juror's protocol contains 5 auxiliary columns and the field for the total final grade.

Your final grade should be indicated in the field Final.

5 auxiliary columns should help you to determine your final grade.

1. Reporter

Starting from 15 points

Adjust your grade with the points in five columns:

Column	Criteria:	min	max
1	Scientific essence of the report	- 5	+5
2	Logical and consistent presentation	- 3	+3
3	Validity of the conclusions	- 2	+3
4	Discussion with Opponent and Reviewer	- 3	+3
5	Technical level of the presentation	- 1	+1

The final grade equals the sum of the starting mark (i.e. 15) and all corrective grades (i.e. columns 1 through 5). The final grade can be from 1 to 30.

2. Opponent

Starting from 10 points

Adjust your grade with the points in five columns:

Column	Criteria	min	max
1	Quality of raised questions	- 2	+2
2	Whether strong sides of the report were well addressed	- 2	+2
3	Whether shortcomings of the report were well addressed	- 2	+2
4	Participation in the discussion with Reporter and Reviewer	- 2	+2
5	Whether demonstrated good and critical own understanding of the problem	- 1	+2

The final grade equals the sum of the starting mark (i.e. 10) and all corrective grades (i.e. columns 1 through 5). The final grade can be from 1 to 20.

3. Reviewer

Starting from 5 points

Adjust your grade with the points in five columns:

Column	Criteria	min	max
1	Quality of raised questions	- 1	+1
2	Whether strong sides of the report and opposition were well addressed	- 1	+1
3	Whether shortcomings of the report and opposition were well addressed	- 1	+1
4	Participation in the discussion with Reporter and Opponent	- 1	+1
5	Whether drew valid and critical conclusions of the preceding performances	- 0	+1

The final grade equals the sum of the starting mark (i.e. 5) and all corrective grades (i.e. columns 1 through 5). The final grade can be from 1 to 10.
